Non-refundable reservation fee of \$60.

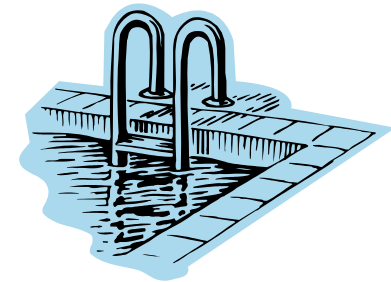
Lifeguard fee of \$35/hour for groups between 1-50. For each additional 50 people, there is an additional lifeguard fee of \$15/hour.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- A. No running in the pool area
- B. No outside food, beverage or coolers are allowed inside the pool area.
- C. No smoking in the pool area
- D. No glass of any sort is allowed in the enclosed pool area.
- E. Persons with open wounds, sores or skin infections will not be allowed in the pool
- F. No pets in the pool area.
- G. All swimmers must take a shower prior to swimming
- H. Children over 5 years of age are not allowed in the wading pool area. All children under the age of 5 in the wading pool must be supervised by an adult, 16 years of age or older. The supervising adult must be inside of the gated wading pool area.
- I. All flotation or swimming devices must be Coast Guard approved and be approved by the Head Lifeguard on duty. Noodles and water wings are not permitted.
- J. Only one person allowed on diving boards at one time. Each diver must wait until preceding diver has surfaced and cleared the diving area. No diving from the side of the diving board or pool edge. No double bouncing on diving board.
- K. Failure to follow rules or instructions given by lifeguards may result in expulsions from the pool. Three expulsions will result in loss of pool privileges for the rest of the year.
- L. The last 15 minutes of each hour, the pool will be exclusively for use by personnel 18 years of age and older
- M. Vulgar language will not be allowed in the pool complex. Appropriate swimsuits must be worn - no cutoffs - no thongs.
- N. Children 10 years or younger must be under the direct supervision of an adult. Children 11-13 years must pass a swim test or be supervised by an adult.
- O. Children who are not potty-trained must wear special swimming diapers. Regular diapers are not allowed.

OPEN SWIM RULES

All persons entering the pools must pay an entry fee. (Swimmers, supervisors, sunbathers, infants, everyone)

Only US Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices will be permitted at the pools.

Individuals supervising children may not be younger than 16 years of age. Individuals may not supervise more than three children and only two can be under the age of six. The individual must have completed American Red Cross Baby Sitting Training Course and have a certificate attesting to this on file at the pool. The individual must also have written authorization from parents of children to seek medical care for children if necessary and have a contact phone number for parents.

Children ages 11-13 must pass the swim test to be left unsupervised. Parents must stay until the children pass the test.

POOL POLICIES

Both pools are open to all authorized customers, regardless of rank.

All personnel who seek admittance to swimming pools using a pool pass must show a valid military ID card (except for children under 10 years of age).

Guests: Guests will not be admitted on pool passes; they must pay daily user fees. No more than two guests will be allowed per authorized sponsor or one guest for a dependent less than 16 years of age. All guests must be accompanied by an authorized customer at all times.

Refunds: Refunds for seasonal pool passes will be made on a prorated basis for personnel on extended TDY. Refunds will only be given at the Outdoor Recreation main office.

Lost Passes: There will be a \$5 fee per pass to issue replacement passes.

Rain Checks: Rain checks will be given to daily admission customers when pools are closed due to bad weather. There will be no cash refunds given.
